Communication – between patients, families, staff and community partners.

Innovation and technology – ideas to provide person-centred outcome focused care including ideas to bring technology into patient care.

Care coordination – coordination of care, including patient journey through the hospital including discharge, transitioning from hospital to home and continuity of care.

Community – partnering with community providers, understanding and meeting the health needs of our culturally diverse community, including the needs of people living with chronic disease.

Patient experience – considering care from a patient and/or carer perspective including provision of consistent care.
