



Expression of Interest: Community Artist Byford Health Hub Community Engagement Artwork Project

Background

The Byford Health Hub (BHH or the 'Hub') is a Labour State government 2021 election commitment to bring more health and social services to the area. The Hub is part of a larger Shire of Serpentine Jarrahdale plan to make Byford a vibrant and connected urban hub and will be located near the new METRONET station. East Metropolitan Health Service (EMHS) is delivering the Hub and will operate it once open. The Hub is planned to open in mid-2026.

The purpose of the artwork engagement project with young people in the local Byford area is to help create a Hub environment that is welcoming to the community through art that matters to them. Young people and their families are key future users of the Hub.

The project will create a collection of artworks that reflects what matters to community, created by local young people. The designs will be used to create branding that is clearly identifiable as representing the Hub and can be used by all Hub services. The designs may also be used in the building, for example as wall features or wayfinding.

The Hub team is seeking an artist who is experienced in working with community members and young people to facilitate the creation of art and design in various mediums. The artist will work with students alongside art teachers at the two local high schools over term two, 2024. A design brief with concepts and local features to consider will be supplied by EMHS to guide the artwork.

Community Artist requirements

- Current Working with Children Check.
- Holds an Australian Business Number or will be able to complete a <u>Statement</u> by a <u>Supplier</u> declaration form.
- Quote for hourly rate provided on application.

Conditions

- Successful applicant/s will be available to work with school students during school hours in term two of 2024. Timing variations may occur, for example with an after-school session.
- All sessions with students are to be delivered in the Byford area.
- The artist may be required to attend planning and design meetings in Byford or Perth city (next to Royal Perth Hospital).
- The artist will be remunerated at an agreed hourly consultant rate for all meeting and session delivery time, parking and other agreed out of pocket expenses.

Selection criteria

- The artist has previous experience with similar projects.
- Experience working with young people and Aboriginal people.
- The quality and creativity of the two work samples provided.

• The two referees confirm the artist showed a high level of skill that helped to achieve the two sample project outcomes.

Delivery date and fees

The dates for sessions and number of hours/sessions are flexible and will be negotiated with the successful artist. The rate of consultant fees will be aligned with industry standards for an hourly rate and negotiated based on the artists experience.
